### **SWINE SHOWMANSHIP**

Thursday, July 14<sup>th</sup>, at 8 a.m. (ct)

Admission to Fairgrounds: \$8.00

1. Open to all youth under 9 years of age.
2. This is strictly a showmanship class. The exhibitor's performance in directing the animal and not the animal itself will be the sole basis of participation.
3. \$15 in money will be offered in each species.
4. Ribbons will be awarded for participation only.
5. Parents must exercise sound judgment in selecting the animal their youngster will exhibit.
6. Exhibitors may be excused if in the opinion of the livestock committee, they present danger to other exhibitors.
7. Exhibitors must be registered prior to the show.
8. Goats shown by novice exhibitors **must** be tipped so that the end of the horn is no larger than ½ inch across.
9. **KUIP Not Required.**

## YOUTH MARKET BEEF SHOW – 2011

Wednesday, July 13<sup>th</sup>, 5 p.m. (ct)

Admission to Fairgrounds: \$8.00

1. Open to all youth at least 9 years old as of January 1st of the current year and who are registered Breckinridge County 4-H or FFA members. (Members are eligible to show in county fair following their graduation from high school). **\*\*All 4-H members must complete the Project Book and turn it in following weigh-in to receive their premium auction awards.**
2. Each youth may exhibit **four (4)** animals in the show. Limit of one animal per exhibitor in the YOUTH PREMIUM AUCTION.
3. Market animals will be shown by classes of market heifers and market steers broken into classes by weights to be set after the weigh-in. Market animals will be weighed in Wednesday, July 13<sup>th</sup>, 9 a.m. (ct). The minimum weight requirement is 800 lbs with a 5 lb variance for scales. No re-weighs will be allowed.
4. All Market heifers must be open. Heifers exhibited in Breeding Heifer Show may not be shown in the Market Show.
5. All entries must be halter broken. Any animal that the show committee considers a hazard to exhibitors, spectators, etc. will be excused from the show and will be ineligible for class placement and premiums.
6. All entries must conform to the official health regulations governing the exhibition of livestock in Kentucky.
7. Market animals shall be owned and under continual care of the exhibitor by KUIP Tagging Date. Animals shall have been identified by a KUIP ear tag and DNA and weighed prior to March 31 of the current year. This identification shall have been witnessed by the Validation Committee. Each exhibitor may tag five market animals. This is in accordance with the Kentucky State Fair Rules.
8. The exhibitor must show his/her own animal. The animal shall be available for inspection within Breckinridge County at any time after the tagging and weigh-in date.
9. A beef showmanship class will be held. Awards will be given to the Champion and Reserve Champion in each division. The showmanship class will be held at the beginning of the Beef Shows.
10. Base price will be determined by the livestock representative.
11. 4-H/FFA youth should groom and fit their own animals with little or no assistance from adults. A minimum of assistance may be provided to youth exhibitors by the following adult individuals: the exhibitor's parents (not to exceed a total of two parents), the exhibitor's local supervising County Extension Agent (4-H Youth Development Agent or Agricultural Agent) or Vocational Agriculture Teacher, and one (1) approved local leader.
12. Use of tail heads or switches will be prohibited in presenting steers for exhibition at these events.
13. An award will be presented to the Overall Champion and Reserve Champion Market Beef Animal.
14. All animals must remain at the fairgrounds from weigh-in time to auction time. All exhibitors must remove their animals from the fairgrounds by 8 a.m. (ct) the morning following the Youth Premium Auction.

## **BEEF HEIFER SHOW - 2011**

**Wednesday, July 13th, following Market Beef Show  
Admission to Fairgrounds \$8.00**

1. Open to youth who are registered Breckinridge County 4-H or FFA members.
2. Animals shown must be registered and must have been registered in the exhibitor's name for at least 45 days. Commercial animals must be owned for at least 45 days.
3. Classes of Heifers will be divided by individual breeds and a commercial class.
4. All entries must conform to the official health regulations governing the exhibition of livestock in Kentucky.
5. All heifers shown must be positively, individually identified as follows: Registered heifers as per association requirements.
6. All animals are to be shown in normal breeding condition.
- 7. Heifers shown in the Market Beef Show cannot be exhibited in the Breeding Heifer Show.**
8. All animals must be broken to a halter.
9. Use of tail heads or switches will be prohibited in presenting heifers for exhibition at these events.
10. No person will be permitted to exhibit more than two (2) animals in the same class.
11. Each exhibitor will show his/her own animal unless two animals are entered in the same class.
12. Judging will be done on the Danish system and the animals placed in blue, red or white group.
13. No animal will be allowed to show more than once except for Championships.
14. The age classification will be from September 1, **2009**, to April 1, **2011**.
15. Ribbons will be given to each class, Grand and Reserve Champion.

## **YOUTH MARKET LAMB SHOW - 2011**

Wednesday, July 13th following the Beef Show

Admission to Fairgrounds: \$8.00

1. Open to all youth at least 9 years old as of January 1st of the current year and who are registered Breckinridge County 4-H or FFA members. (Members are eligible to show in county fair following their graduation from high school). **\*\*All 4-H members must complete the Project Book and turn it in following weigh-in to receive their premium auction awards.**
2. Each youth may exhibit **four (4)** animals in the show. Limit of one animal per exhibitor in the YOUTH PREMIUM AUCTION.
3. Market lambs will be judged on the basis of their ability to cut out show day.
4. Lambs will be weighed in from 9:00 AM (CT), Wednesday, July 13th. **The minimum weight requirement is 80 lbs with a 5 lb variance for scales.** No re-weighs will be allowed.
5. All entries must conform to the official health regulations governing the exhibition of livestock in Kentucky.
6. Lambs shall have been identified by a KUIP ear tag and DNA Testing. This identification shall have been completed by Validation Committee prior to June 1 of the current year. Each exhibitor may tag six lambs. This is in accordance with the Kentucky State Fair Rules.
7. The animals being exhibited must be owned and under the continuous care of the exhibitor from the KUIP tagging date. The exhibitor must show his/her own animal. The animal shall be available for inspection within Breckinridge County at any time after the tagging date.
8. A showmanship class of Market and Breeding Sheep will be held. Awards will be given to the Champion and Reserve Champion in each division. The showmanship class will be held at the beginning of the Lamb Shows.
9. There will be a novice weight class. Animals must be KUIP and DNA identified in the exhibitor's name. Co-owned animals can be exhibited in both novice and 4-H/FFA weight classes. Novice exhibitors will not participate in the youth livestock auction.
10. Base price will be determined by the packer according to grade and yield.
11. 4-H/FFA youth should groom and fit their own animals with little or no assistance from adults. A minimum of assistance may be provided to youth exhibitors by the following adult individuals: the exhibitor's parents (not to exceed a total of two parents), the exhibitor's local supervising County Extension Agent (4-H Youth Development Agent or Agricultural Agent) or Vocational Agriculture Teacher, and one (1) approved local leader.
12. An award will be given to Overall Champion and Reserve Champion Market Lamb
13. All animals must remain at the fairgrounds from weigh-in time to auction time. All exhibitors must remove their animals from the fairgrounds by 8 a.m. (ct) the morning following the Youth Premium Auction.

## YOUTH MARKET HOG SHOW - 2011

Thursday, July 14<sup>th</sup> at 8 a.m. (ct)

1. Open to all youth at least 9 years old as of January 1st of the current year and who are registered Breckinridge County 4-H or FFA members. (Members are eligible to show in County Fair following their graduation from high school). **\*\* All 4-H members must complete the Project Book and turn it in following weigh-in to receive their premium auction awards.**
2. Each youth may exhibit six (6) animals in the show. Limit of one animal per exhibitor in the YOUTH PREMIUM AUCTION.
3. Weigh-in will be Wednesday, July 13<sup>th</sup>, 9 – 11 a.m. (ct). **The minimum weight requirement is 130 lbs with a 5 lb variance for scales.** No re-weighs will be allowed.
4. All entries must conform to the official health regulations governing the exhibition of livestock in Kentucky. In addition all entries must have an official health certificate according to Kentucky State regulations. Certificates will be checked before exhibitor will be allowed to unload livestock.
5. All hogs must have been owned and be under continuous care prior to the KUIP Tagging Date. Market Hogs shall have been identified by a KUIP ear tag and DNA prior to the KUIP Tagging Date. This identification shall have been completed by the Validation Committee. Each exhibitor may tag 10 hogs. This is in accordance with the Kentucky State Fair Rules. The animals shall be available for inspection within Breckinridge County at any time after the tagging date.
6. The exhibitor must show his/her own animal.
7. A showmanship class will be held for all youth. The showmanship class will be held at the beginning of the Youth Market Show.
8. (Optional) The animals will be taken from the auction ring by truck to the packer, unless exhibitor is registered for the Kentucky State Fair.
9. 4-H/FFA youth should groom and fit their own animals with little or no assistance from adults. A minimum of assistance may be provided to youth exhibitors by the following adult individuals: the exhibitor's parents (not to exceed a total of two parents), the exhibitor's local supervising County Extension Agent (4-H Youth Development Agent or Agricultural Agent) or Vocational Agriculture Teacher, and one (1) approved local leader.
10. There will be a novice weight class. Animals must be KUIP and DNA identified in the exhibitor's name. Co-owned animals can be exhibited in both novice and 4-H/FFA weight classes. Novice exhibitors will not participate in the youth livestock auction.
11. Base price will be determined by the livestock representative.
12. Awards will be presented to the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Market Hog.

13. All animals must remain at the fairgrounds from weigh-in time to auction time. All exhibitors must remove their animals from the fairgrounds by 8 a.m. (ct) the morning following the Youth Premium Auction.

**YOUTH MARKET GOAT SHOW - 2011**

Thursday, July 14th, following the Swine Shows

Admission to Fairgrounds: \$8.00

1. Open to all youth at least 9 years old as of January 1st of the current year and who are registered Breckinridge County 4-H or FFA members. (Members are eligible to show in county fair following their graduation from high school). **\*\*All 4-H members must complete the Project Book and turn it in following weigh-in in order to receive their premium auction awards.**
2. Each youth may exhibit **four (4)** animals in the show. Limit of one animal per exhibitor in the YOUTH PREMIUM AUCTION.
3. Market goats will be judged on the basis of their ability to cut out show day.
4. Goats will be weighed in from 9 a.m. (ct), Wednesday, July 13th. **The minimum weight requirement is 40 lbs with a 5 lb variance for scales. No re-weighs will be allowed.**
5. All entries must conform to the official health regulations governing the exhibition of livestock in Kentucky.
6. Goats shall have been identified by a KUIP ear tag and DNA tested. This identification shall have been completed by the Validation Committee prior to June 1st of the current year. Each exhibitor may tag six (6) goats. This is in accordance with the Kentucky State Fair Rules.
7. The animals being exhibited must be owned and under the continuous care of the exhibitor from the KUIP tagging date. The exhibitor must show his/her own animal. The animal shall be available for inspection within Breckinridge County at any time after the tagging date.
8. Horns are optional, but must be tipped. Tipped is defined as the end of the horn must be squared off ½ inch in diameter or larger.
9. A showmanship class of Market Goats will be held. Awards will be given to the Champion and Reserve Champion in each division. The showmanship class will be held at the beginning of the Goat Shows.
10. There will be a novice weight class. Co-owned animals can be exhibited in both novice and 4-H/FFA weight classes. Animals must be KUIP identified in the exhibitor's name. Novice exhibitors will not participate in the youth livestock auction.
11. Base price will be determined by the packer according to grade and yield.
12. 4-H/FFA youth should groom and fit their own animals with little or no assistance from adults. A minimum of assistance may be provided to youth exhibitors by the following adult individuals: the exhibitor's parents (not to exceed a total of two parents), the exhibitor's local supervising County Extension Agent (4-H Youth Development Agent or Agricultural Agent) or Vocational Agriculture Teacher, and one (1) approved local leader.

13. An award will be given to Overall Champion and Reserve Champion Market Goat.
14. All animals must remain at the fairgrounds from weigh-in time to auction time. All exhibitors must remove their animals from the fairgrounds by 8 a.m. (ct) the morning following the Youth Premium Auction.

## **2011 YOUTH PREMIUM AUCTION**

**Thursday, July 14th, 6:30 p.m. (ct)**

**Admission to Fairgrounds: \$8.00**

1. Only animals which have shown in the Breckinridge County 4-H/FFA Youth Livestock Show are eligible for the premium auction.
2. Each exhibitor is allowed to participate with one (1) animal in the Youth Premium Auction. If a youth should win two (2) or more championships in any species, they may only select one animal to sell in the auction. The other animals will be exhibited and recognized.
3. The auction order will begin with the Grand Champions and then the Reserve Champions, the market hog first, the market lamb second, then market goat third, the market beef fourth, the poultry fifth and then rabbit based on a yearly rotational system. The remaining auction order will be determined by blue ribbon, red ribbon, and white ribbon placing before the auction begins.
4. All animals must be in place promptly at auction time. Any animal which fails to meet these requirements will be disqualified from the auction.
5. An entry fee may be charged for placing an animal in the auction.
6. Each exhibitor will be responsible for assisting in loading his/her animal.
7. Base price for the animals will be set at the fair by stockyards representative. The actual price an exhibitor receives will be the difference in base price and auction price.
8. All animals must remain on the grounds from show time until auction time.
9. All checks should be made payable to the Breckinridge County Youth Auction. It is requested settlements be made the night of the auction, if possible. All premiums must be paid within 30 days.
10. The exhibitor reserves the right to show their animal at the KY State Fair.
