### 2011 National 4-H Congress

Angela Lauer and Josiah Myers represented Campbell County 4-H and the State of Kentucky at this year's National 4-H Congress. They were selected to attend this National 4-H Event through the 4-H Honors Program participation and regional interviews.

There were 25 delegates and 3 chaperones chosen from Kentucky to attend this 90th Congress held November 25th-29th in Atlanta, Georgia. More than 1200 delegates from throughout the United States gathered to hear outstanding community leaders and educators address current issues and needs.

Educational, recreational and networking activities focused on leadership, community service, empowerment and cultural diversity. Delegates also were exposed to many cultural and educational resources. These experiences help teens become capable, competent and caring citizens as they bring this knowledge back to their local communities.

Since 1909, Kentucky 4-H has aspired to "Make the Best Better." Kentucky 4-H and the people who make it happen are dedicated to improving both educational and recognition opportunities for both 4-H members and volunteers.

The Planning Committee has worked for more than a year to plan this big event. The Kentucky 4-H Volunteer Forum is the second largest of its kind in terms of attendance. With a four year average attendance of 725, the Kentucky Forum is larger than each of the Regional 4-H Volunteer Forums as well!

The biennial two-day 4-H Volunteer Forum was initiated in 2000; the year of the millennium. This became a great way to kick-off this new beginning in the life of Kentucky 4-H Volunteerism. The theme of this year's Forum is "Kentucky 4-H Volunteers: Leading the Revolution" All told, over 100 hours of educational workshops are being offered which cover the entire spectrum of 4-H Youth Development programs, activities and curricula.

The seventh class of the Kentucky 4-H Volunteer Hall of Fame Awards will be inducted on Friday evening. These include: the TEAM (Together Everyone Accomplishes More) Award; the ICE (Innovative, Creative, Enthusiastic) Award; the Community Service Award; the Leadership Development Award; the Conrad Feltner Memorial Awards; the Partners in Progress Award; the Lifetime Achievement Award. The purpose of the Hall of Fame awards is two-fold. First, our goal is to recognize the contributions which volunteers have made to the Kentucky 4-H Program. Second, we want to recognize volunteers for the impact which they make upon the lives of 4-H members in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

We hope that you'll enjoy the interesting workshops, are inspired by our motivational speaker, will gain a new programming idea, network with volunteers from other counties, congratulate the award winners, get some exercise at Friday evening's dance and generally get rejuvenated and ready to tackle another year as a volunteer leader!
