## Kentucky State Fair Selection Day

August 4, 2011

Thursday, August 4 is the day for getting your state fair entries to the 4-H office for judging. The office hours are 8:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m.

Sewing projects have already been judged for the state fair. Be prepared to fill out forms on all exhibits.

You will need to label your project with the following information on each item: name, birth date and age, address, telephone number, social security number and grade you were in last spring. Also include the class number that corresponds to the project. Information about the various projects and classes and other entry information is available online or at the 4-H office. Read through it carefully, and if you have any questions call 572-2600 and ask for Owen.

4-H'ers can enter an item from different projects, but not two from the same project, except where noted in the rules. Look over the list carefully before bringing your items in to be sure they fit the description. Please make sure that you abide by the rules. Adhere to all deadlines—no exceptions will be made. All of the state fair forms are available in the office.

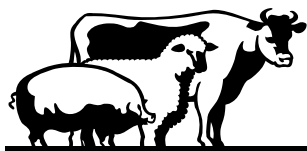

In 2011 youth and open livestock exhibitors will have the opportunity after May 1st to enter online at [www.kystatefair.org](http://www.kystatefair.org). Credit cards are required to enter online and all information must be complete. In addition, for youth wishing to enter both the open and youth show, there will not be a combined entry fee; you will pay an entry fee for each.

Pick up your items on Friday, August 5 from 11:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

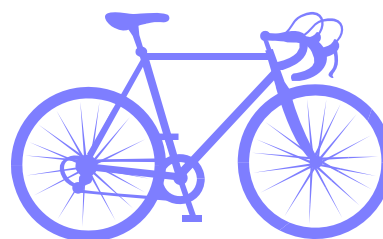

## Cinnamon Peach Crisp

- 6 cups peach slices (about 3 pounds)
- 1 cup oatmeal, uncooked
- 1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup margarine, melted
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg



- Heat oven to 350° F. Place peaches in an 8-inch square baking dish. Combine remaining ingredients, mixing until crumbly. Sprinkle crumb mixture over peaches. Bake for 30 minutes or until peaches are tender and topping is golden brown.
- Serve with vanilla ice cream or low-fat frozen yogurt.

Yield: 8 1/2-cup servings.
