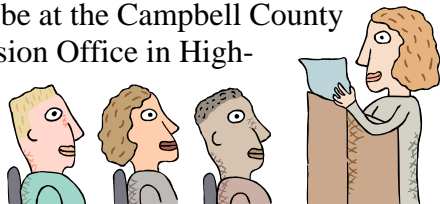

### Ms. Bass Class 1

On March 2nd, we had our 4-H meeting. Mr. Prim came to visit our classroom again to teach us a new lesson. This time we were learning about simple machines and got to build a bookshelf. First we talked about why the wood had lines. We learned the lines were made from the rings of the tree. A tree gets new rings every year.

We sanded down our wood pieces to make it smooth. We were using a force called friction. Then we learned how to use the hammer as a lever to remove a nail. We talked about different ways we could hold our bookshelf together. We decided to use wood glue and nails.

Our shelves turned out great and we all used stickers, markers, and color pencils to put designs on our shelves. We always have fun with Mr. Prim. I can't wait until he comes back.

### Ms. Bass Class 2

For our March 4-H meeting, Mr. Prim returned to our class to teach us another great Science lesson. This time we got to build real bookshelves. This lesson taught us about the seven simple machines. Which are lever, wheel and axle, pulley, wedge, inclined plane, screw, and gears.

We used a hammer as a lever when building our shelves if we messed up and had to remove a nail and we used nails as a wedge to keep the pieces together. First, we had to use sand paper to shave the wood shaving off and make all the pieces nice and smooth. When sanding we were using the force of friction to do work.

After we constructed our shelves with nails, hammer, and wood glue, we all decided to decorate our shelves with art supplies. The next time Mr. Prim comes we will be making lamps. That sure sounds like fun!
