Outstanding 4-Her Awards 2011

The Campbell County 4-H Advisory Council held its annual 4-H Recognition Night on October 4th to recognize all of the outstanding youth involved in the clubs' programs and activities over the past year. As part of the recognition program, two overall Outstanding Senior 4-Her's are named each year. This year's winners were Nicole Robertson and Josiah Myers.

Nicole Robertson is the 15-year-old daughter of Janet and Steve Robertson of Alexandria. She has been a 4-H member for six years. Her projects have included Sewing, Arts & Crafts, Photography and Foods. She has participated in the 4-H Fashion Revue, given talks and promoted 4-H to younger youth and teens. She reported that over the past 6 years to have entered 116 projects and record books at the Alexandria Fair and 37 of her projects have gone on to represent Campbell County 4-H at the Kentucky State Fair.



Nicole is currently serving as a teen leader for the St. Mary 4-H Club and participates in numerous community service activities through the 4-H Teen Club. Some of her major 4-H awards include Construction Awards at the 4-H Fashion Show; Champion photography, electricity, ceramics and crochet at the Alexandria Fair; and Champion Foods at the Kentucky State Fair.

At Campbell County High School she is a member of the varsity swim team, academic team, FCCLA, Fun Bunch, Beta Club, FBLA and serves as the contact for the 4-H Teen Club.

Josiah Myers is the 17-year-old son of Cheryl and Steve Myers of California. He has been a 4-H member for eight years. His projects include Electric, Horse, Market Lamb, Market Hog, Market Goat, Geology, Shooting Sports and Home Environment. He has also been quite successful in the 4-H Demonstration Program and has won championship at the county and district levels for his demonstrations given. He has attended 4-H Horse Camp as well as attended Be The E Day Camp and Health Rocks Day Camp.

He has won major awards at the Alexandria Fair on his 4-H Livestock Projects and on his Record Books. At the District and State 4-H Horse Shows he has won High Point Awards several times as well. He has achieved both the Bronze and Silver Honors Awards and has been selected to attend the 2011 National 4-H Congress in Atlanta next month.

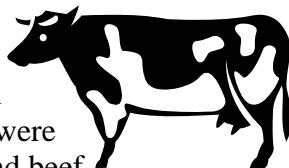

Grow It, Eat It, Wear It

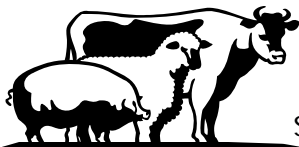

2012 4-H Country Ham Project



Plans are under way for the 2012 4-H Country Ham Project. If you are interested in participating, the money and contracts are due to Owen on or before December 1. The cost this year is \$55 for 2 hams. 4-Hers must complete 6 hours of education training from a certified 4-H Livestock volunteer and give a 3-5 minute presentation at the 2012 Kentucky State Fair.

4-H Honors Program Deadline December 1

If you are a senior 4-H member between the ages of 14-17 as of January 1, 2011, you are eligible to complete the 4-H Honors Awards. The 4-H Honors Program is intended to recognize 4-H participants who have outstanding accomplishments and to provide incentive for youth to increase their knowledge, skills and abilities through 4-H Projects and Activities. It is not a contest. If you meet the point requirements you will receive recognition through this program. It will look good on scholarship applications and resumes, too!

The Kentucky 4-H Honors Program has three levels. The levels are Bronze, Silver and Gold. The Gold Level is being referred to as similar to the Eagle Scout Award. You may only complete one level per year and after completing the first level (Bronze) you can apply for a trip to National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, Georgia. Campbell County has been successful in having delegates to this National 4-H Event for the last several years.
