2. Exhibits must have been made or grown by the 4-Her since September 1, **2008**. 4-Hers may make only one exhibit per class and must have been enrolled in the project during the current project year (Sept. 1, **2008**-August 31, **2009**).
3. Exhibits must be entered between 8 a.m. and 12 noon Thursday, **August 20, 2009**. Exhibits must be removed between **2 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. Sunday, August 23, 2009**.
4. Exhibits will be classified as blue, red, or white. Purple denotes class champion.
5. All entries must meet minimum standards to receive a ribbon. Exhibits of poor quality will be disqualified & no award will be paid on them.
6. Judge's decisions are final.
7. The management will use care to guard and protect exhibits, but are not responsible for loss or damage.
8. Any exhibits removed before the designated time for removal will result in forfeited prize money.

819 – *Intermediate: More Embroidery 201*- exhibit one of the following:

Item of free embroidery on plain woven fabric, 6 different stitches, 3 or more colors, 7 x 9 inches, counted cross stitch on 14 count Aida cloth, 5 x 7 inches, huck embroidery on huck toweling, 2 inch wide border design, crewel embroidery on linen or cotton twill fabric, 6 x 8 inches

820 – *Advanced: Creative Embroidery 301*

821 – *Young Junior: Learn to Knit* -Exhibit one item or pair of items using **4 ply worsted** weight yarn. Must include garter stitch, stockinette stitch and/or ribbing stitch.

822 – *Beginner: Knit One and Purl, Too!* - Exhibit one item or pair of items. May use yarn other than **4 ply worsted** weight yarn. Two colors and one pattern stitch may be used in addition to garter, stockinette stitch, and/or ribbing stitch.

823- *Intermediate: Keep on Knitting* - Exhibit one item or pair of items using pick-up stitches, multiple color changes and/or circular knitting. Must include increase or decrease. May use other than **4 ply worsted** weight yarn.

824 – *Advanced: Knitter's Choice* - Exhibit one item or pair of items using charted designs or design your own. May include Fair Isle knitting, Aran Island knitting lace knitting, or knitting with beads.. Original designs must include documentation.
