1. No person allowed more than one entry per class, but may enter in as many classes as desired.
2. Articles must be entered between 11:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m., Wednesday, June 18<sup>th</sup>.
3. Exhibitors must be Clinton County residents.
4. All entries should be clean and made within the previous year unless otherwise noted; any article that has been exhibited at the county fair in past years is not eligible to compete for a premium. Items entered in Textiles Division may be entered in the year they are completed.
5. No commercial exhibitors other than the professional photography class.
6. Articles must be picked up between 10:00 a.m.-12:00 noon on Friday, June 20. Early pick up of exhibits means forfeiture of premiums unless prior arrangements have been made.
7. The Clinton County Extension Homemakers, Cooperative Extension Staff or Fair Board will not be responsible for any loss. Efforts will be made to prevent any losses. Decisions of the judges are final.
8. Only three ribbons will be awarded in each class. First place is a blue ribbon, second place is a red ribbon and third place is a white ribbon. Judges have the discretion of not awarding a first place blue ribbon if the product is not of blue ribbon quality. There will be a Grand Champion ribbon awarded in every division.

### Premiums:

Blue: \$5

Red: \$4

White: \$3

Ribbons will be awarded in each subcategory as judged. Grand Champion ribbons will be rewarded to one individual per division.

### Judging Criteria:

Baked Foods- appearance, texture, flavor, aroma, taste

Candies- appearance, flavor, texture, taste

Canning- appearance of pack, head space, preparation and selection of canned products; all items must be well sealed.

Sewing- Fabric, workmanship, general appearance

Crafts- design, color, workmanship, general appearance

Produce- freshness, maturity, color, proper size, uniformity

Floral- freshness, good foliage, insect free, plant and flowers grown by exhibitors, uniformity of arrangement

Senior Folk Art: Same as above.

Junior Weaving- One pair of placemats, pot holders (pair) or one small wall hanging item that is made through various weaving techniques using mix media fibers, no plastic materials allowed. Baskets are not included. Wall hangings must be mounted and be ready for hanging.

Senior Weaving- One item (only one item is permitted for entry); rug, belt, stool with woven seat, or wall hanging item made through various weaving techniques using mixed media fibers, no plastic materials allowed. Baskets are not included. Wall hangings must be mounted and be ready for hanging.

Junior & Senior Basket Making - Natural materials, any size, shape or design. Non-natural materials may be woven into design.

**All drawings and paintings must be mounted on a sturdy background (mat board) and framed ready to hang with secured hangers on the frame (wire hangers). No poster board allowed. Drawings and paintings must be framed.**

Junior Nature Crafts – Wall Wreath made from natural materials only. NO KITS ALLOWED. Must include wire or hooks and be ready for hanging. (No other item allowed)

Senior Nature Crafts – Wall Wreath or hand carved native materials made from natural materials only NO KITS ALLOWED. Must include wire or hooks and be ready for hanging. (No other item allowed)

Junior & Senior Acrylic/Oil Painting- Items that are made through the process of painting on paper or canvas, using any acrylic or oil process. Paint-by-number will be disqualified. No kits, original work only.

Junior & Senior Color Drawing- Items made through the use of drawing lines using pen, pencil, pastel, charcoal, markers or chalk

Junior & Senior Black & White Drawing- Items made through the use of drawing lines using pen, pencil, charcoal, markers or chalk. NO ADDITIONAL COLORS

Junior & Senior Watercolor Painting-Items made through the process of painting on paper or canvas using any watercolor process.

### **Second Year**

2<sup>nd</sup> Year Entry- 20 Leaves. Collection of 20 leaves representing 20 forest trees and different ones done by same exhibitor in the first year project found in Kentucky. Mounting instructions in the forestry book, “4-H Forestry Project Unit I-Introducing Yourself to Trees” (4DF-01PA or most recent version) Activity #1 are to be followed.

  - b. Horticulture photography: a 4-H'er may enter any of the classes in addition to general photography.
