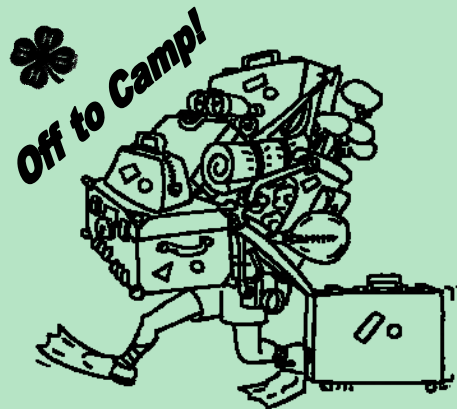


**Parents

Boys and girls age 9-13.

Living accommodations

Campers stay in cabins with 12-18 other campers and at least one adult and one junior counselor leader. Boys and girls have separate camp sights and cabins.



What other counties will be camping with Gallatin County?

This year Boone, Carroll, Grant and Counties will be camping with Gallatin County at the North Central 4-H Center.

What's 4-H Camp like?

A typical day begins with wake-up about 7:45 a.m. and a hearty breakfast. Everybody pitches in after breakfast to kept the camp in tip-top condition. Campers gather around the flag pole for morning flag



raising and singing. The morning is filled with fun classes. In the afternoon, campers enjoy special programs. A little free time and campers are back to the flag pole for the flag lowering ceremony. After supper, everyone comes together for night activities, such as water Olympics, field Olympics, recreation, folk dancing, games and campfire. Cabin lights are turned off by 11:00 p.m.

What about the food?



The food is great - eggs, bacon, biscuits, cereal, pancakes, juice, pizza, hoagie sandwiches, hamburgers, ham dinner, roast beef, spaghetti, turkey and dressing, vegetables and fruit desserts. Mmmmm good!

What can 4-H Camp do for campers?

4-H Camp helps prepare campers for the "real world" by introducing them to concepts like being responsible for your own possessions, cleaning up after yourself, socializing with various age groups, respecting others and their property and coping with being away from home for a short time. 4-H Camp is a fun way to learn these valuable traits.

How much does 4-H Camp cost?

The cost for 2009 will be \$160.00, which includes housing, insurance, meals, transportation, most classes and a 2009 4-H Camp T-Shirt.



How do I register to go to 4-H Camp?

Call the Gallatin Co. Extension Office at (859)567-5481 to register and pay at least half (\$80.00) of the camp fee by June 12, 2009 or all of the fee (\$160.00) no later than June 26, 2009.

Is there a payment plan?

Yes, you can make your first deposit of \$80.00 by June 12, 2009. The second deposit of \$80.00 is due no later than June 26, 2009.



Please note: The \$80.00 deposit is non-refundable if cancellation occurs after June 26, 2009. (Also, there will be no refund if a child has to return home early due to illness, head lice or disciplinary action).
