Boucherie Vineyards – 6545 Keyway Dr., Spottsville - 270-826-6192—Established in 2005, our small farm vineyard currently grows 10 varieties of American and French hybrid grapes. Our current customers make jelly, juice and wine. We are in the process of establishing Boucherie Winery. Located on US Hwy 60, 7.5 miles on the left from the US Hwy 41 & US Hwy 60 interchange.

Double A Farms—Freshwater Prawn Harvest & Sale—Tim Alexander—270-869-0942—Prawn Pond location is located on Hwy 41-A, South of Hwy 425 —These locally grown “shrimp” will be sold fresh from the pond today! They have a texture and taste somewhere between shrimp and lobster and can be cooked in a variety of ways. Prawns sold on a first come-first serve basis for \$10/lb. We highly recommend you bring a cooler and ice to ensure freshness on the journey home. Plans are to start a buyers sign-in with selling to begin at noon, but come as early as 10 a.m. to watch the “Shrimp Wranglers” play in the mud while harvesting this year’s crop.

Fun Farm—2321 Alves Ferry Road, Henderson - 270-546-9291—The first question always asked is, “What do you use a llama for?” The answer is simple, “Come visit my farm and find out!” The 4-Hers in my Llama Lease Program can answer all your questions and more. See demonstrations on grooming, showing, an obstacle course and llama fiber. 4-Hers will have posters on display filled with llama information. We have 39 llamas and alpacas on our farm, so stop by and visit!
