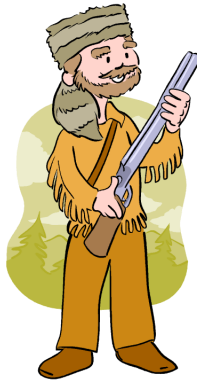

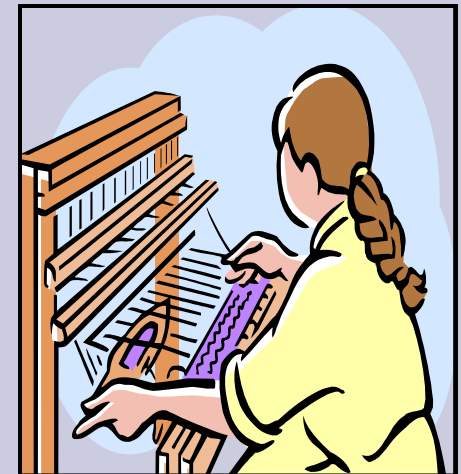

Heritage Days at Mountain Home Place

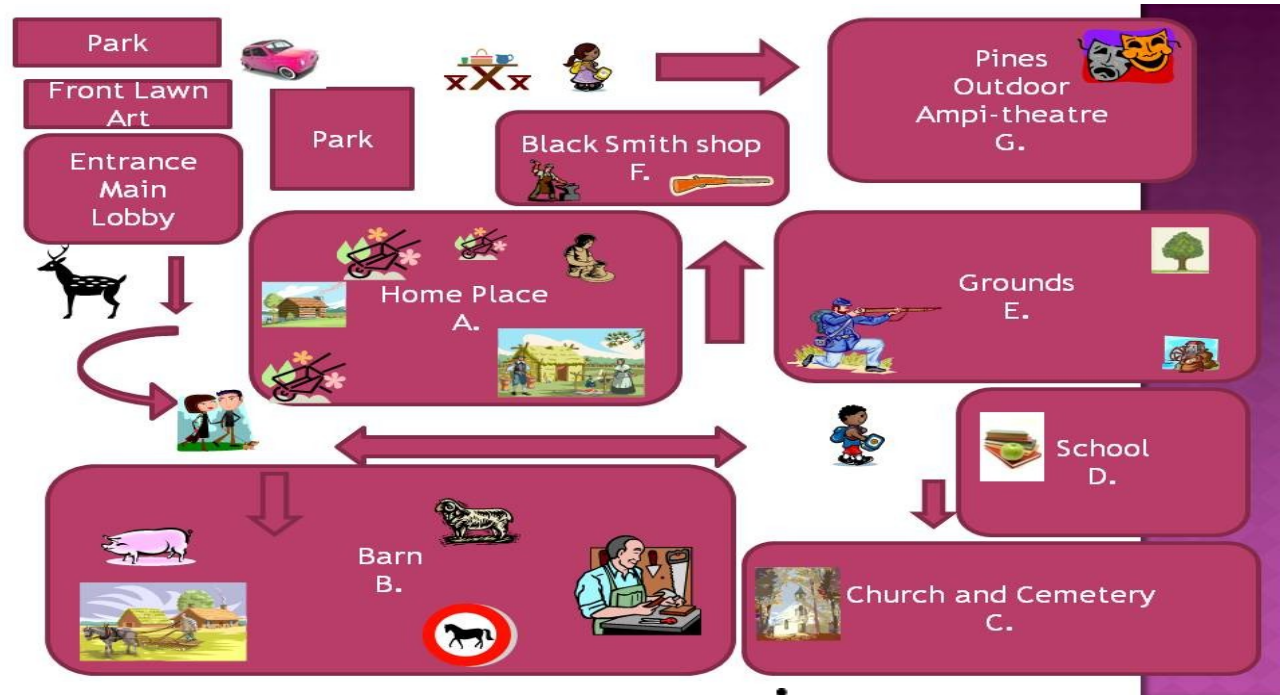
- Front Lawn: Artists and Craftsmen
