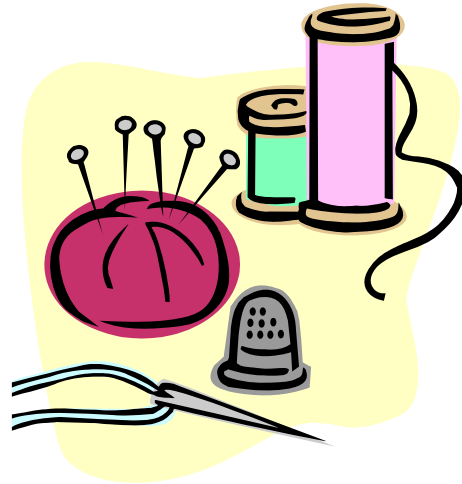

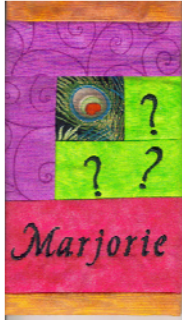

“Make It & Take It” Description

* Bring your own sewing machine with thread; all other supplies will be furnished.



A. Patchwork Name Tag – If you didn’t have a chance to make a name tag last year, this is your opportunity. These nametags will have your name embroidered on the front. Participants may choose a patchwork design for their nametag.

B. Fabric Gift Bag - Participants will use scrap fat quarters to complete a quilted gift bag with fabric handles and matching tag perfect for any occasion.



C. Pocket Pack Tissue Holder - These are so easy, kids can make them by the dozen. Use calicos and lace for Grandma, and denim for dad.

D. Iron Caddy - This is a purse-like caddy which holds an iron. It also doubles as an ironing pad.

Advanced: For sewers who want a challenge. Advanced details and techniques will be presented. Some classes may have 2 individuals per table at discretion of teacher.

“It’s Sew Fine” 2012 Class Descriptions

Tuesday, April 17

E. Cosmetic Serger-y with Gail Yellen (Intermediate)

This is a class on blending of construction and decorative serger techniques. The serger can be used as an embellishment tool. Participants will leave with a workbook loaded with valuable information, samples, and inspiration. Participants need to be able to thread their serger and change needles. **Class Fee:** \$40.00 includes: fabric, lace, fibers for weaving, 1 spool of Jean Stitch thread, wire for wire-edge ribbon, an instruction handout, filler cord for serger braid, 1/8"-wide elastic, a double eye needle (for weaving), trim, wire, and lace.



F. Accessorizing Your Purse in Three Parts with Sandy Davis (Beginner to Intermediate)

This organizer will be transferable from purse to purse without having to remove the items. You will also make a coordinating tissue holder with optional piping and a cosmetic/catch-all bag quilted with a built-in decorative stitch. Finished size: Organizer- 21 1/2" x 8 1/2", Cosmetic bag- 11" x 7 1/2", and Tissue holder fits pocket-size tissues. **Class Fee: \$30.00** includes: instructions, Timex or Peltex stiff interfacing for foldable purse organizer unit.



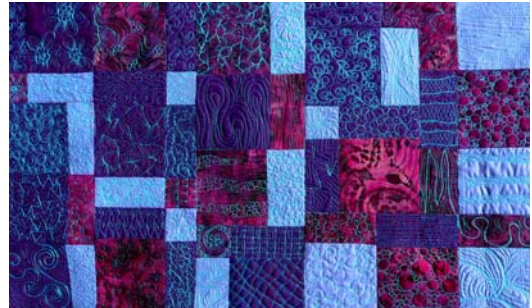
G. Charming Wrist Purse with Jenfer Klee (Beginner all levels)

Grab that charm pack, honey bun roll or fabric from your stash to sew this cute zippered purse to keep a small wallet and phone or small sewing tools/quilting projects. Finished size: 7" x 5 1/2" x 2 1/2" **Class Fee: \$18.00** includes: purse pattern, fusible interfacing, and quilt batting.



I. Deconstructed Nine Patch with Dina Buckey (Intermediate)

Participants will construct a quilt top measuring 32" x 19". It will start with a traditional nine patch block, then cut each block up and reassemble into a visually pleasing composition. Every quilt will be different. **Class Fee: \$25.00** includes: instructions.



H. Kanzashi with Linda Griffiths (Beginner)

This is a traditional Japanese art form of folding and stitching fabric petals. You will make flowers for a vase or necklace using flower maker templates to speed the process. You can use these for jewelry, hair accessories, apparel, and more. Finished size: 32" x 19". **Class Fee: \$25.00** includes: two flower templates (large & small), wire flower stems, floral tape, stamens, felt, glue, necklace findings, threads, plus several brochures with more ideas.



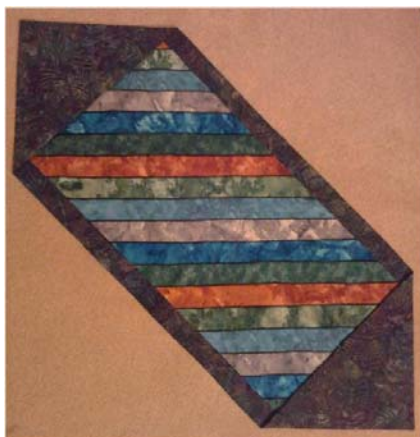
J. 4-Sided Placemat with Rita Hardman (Beginner)

One template makes a four-sided placemat. Construction of this placemat will consist of no seams showing. **Class Fee: \$22.00** includes: template, fabric kit, and instructions.



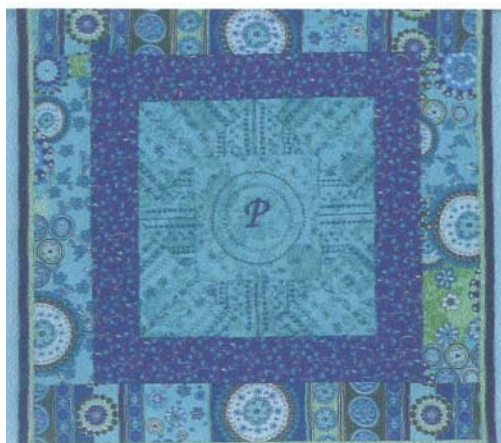
**K. Spiral Serged Table Runner
with Marjorie Baker (Intermediate)**

Learn this interesting way to create bias striped fabric with the use of the serger rolled edge stitch, the illusion of piping can be created at the same time your piecing is done. Once the fabric has been created, it will turn into a fun table runner. Finished size: 15" x 36". **Class Fee: \$5.00** includes: instructions.



**L. Decorative Stitch Wallhanging
with Patsy Shields (Intermediate)**

Create a small wallhanging using the decorative stitches on your machine. Add contrast borders, a small "flange" in a contrast color with a solid binding. Learn circular stitching, mitered corners, and more. Finished size: 20" x 20". **Class Fee: \$15.00** includes: stabilizer, pattern, fabrics, and thread.



**M. Learn Basic Quilting Skills
with Sheila Reinke (All skill levels)**

Participants will make a brown, blue, rust and green square table topper with four different quilt block patterns, and will also learn the math to create any size of blocks. Included will be flying geese, triangle squares, hour glass, and more. Make perfect sashings, borders, and bindings. Finished size: 33-inch square. **Class Fee: \$40.00** includes: fabric to make table topper, batting, and backing.



**N. Free Motion Machine Quilting Design
with Kay Wilson (Intermediate)**

This is a lecture design class only for both longarm and domestic machine quilters. Learn movement, flow, and technique to advance quilting skills. The goal is to teach continuous line quilting designs for use without marking the quilt top. Feathers, sashing, and background fills will be taught. Class will NOT cover fundamentals of machine quilting. **Class Fee: \$25.00** which includes handouts.

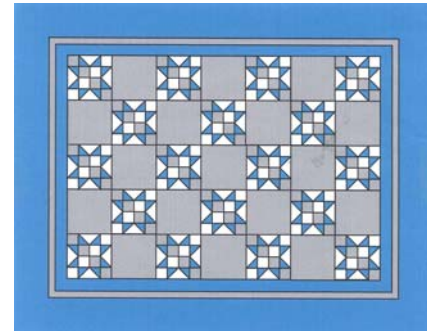
O. Patriot Star Banner with Cindy Casciato (Intermediate)

Learn how to quickly piece two star blocks utilizing the Magic Triangle Method. Participants will also experience how to set blocks on point. Project will be a quick-turn project with no binding. **Class Fee: \$25.00** includes: pattern for multiple size quilts. A pre-cut fabric kit can be purchased for an additional \$25.00 that includes all fabric for project. For \$10, participants can purchase the additional magic tool or use the one provided in class (can be purchased day of class).



Q. Bugle Boy with Rita Hardman (Intermediate)

Learn how to make this quilt using the “Square in Square” technique. The blocks will be constructed without cutting or sewing a single triangle. Finished size: 48” x 61”. **Class Fee: \$35.00** includes: fabric kit and pattern. Participants can purchase the ruler during class or use one provided. Price of ruler ranges from \$20 (ruler) to \$30 (ruler plus patterns and booklet).



P. Creating Color & Value Gradiations with Procion MX Dyes with Pat Sturtzel (Intermediate)

Learn to dye fabric creating 3 gradations of color, a series of fabrics between 2 primary colors, a series of fabrics across the color wheel and a series of fabrics progressing from light to dark. **Class Fee: \$45.00** includes: dyes and miscellaneous materials. For an additional \$25.00 will include 6 yards of pre-washed, dyeable fabric (200 ct cotton or cotton/bamboo).



R. Faux Woven Scarf with Patsy Shields (Beginner to Intermediate)

Create a beautiful scarf made from thread. Using stitches from your machine and stabilizer in no time the scarf will be finished. It will be “one of a kind”. Finished size: 6-8 inches wide and 36-48 inches long. **Class Fee: \$25.00** includes: threads, stabilizer, and instructions.



**S. Collage It! with Gail Yellen
(Intermediate to Advance)**

Go green with the ultimate recycling project. Take old sweaters or sweatshirts and learn how to use the Counterpoints Jacket pattern to create this one-of-a-kind jacket. You will explore felting, interfacing, combining colors and textures and stitch choices for butted seams. You will also see various options for closures & neckline fit. **Class Fee: \$65.00** includes: counterpoints Jacket pattern and choice of one template set.



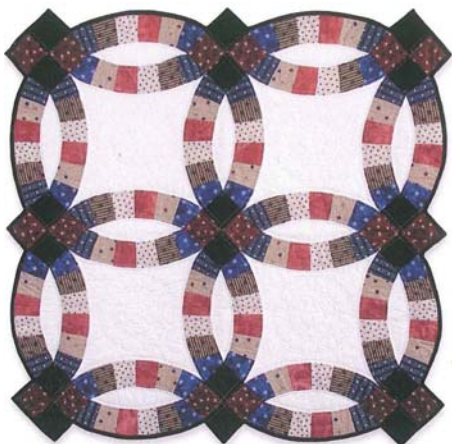

**T. Double Wedding Ring with Kay Wilson
(Intermediate)**

This class takes the intimidation out of those curves. Basic “old fashioned” techniques will be taught using a little secret for perfect curves. Students will need to be confident of their ¼” seam stitching and be patient with themselves. Class kits will be precut and ready to sew. Finished size: 30” x 30”. **Class Fee: \$45.00** includes: instructions and all fabrics required for class.



U. Sewing Accessory Tote with Kaye Littrell and Sue Wash (Intermediate)

This tote accommodates cutting board, rulers, rotary cutter, pin cushion, scissors etc. (Participants will need to do some pre-class cutting, but project will be complete before leaving.) Finished size: 25” long x 18” high x 7” deep **Class Fee: \$20.00** includes: pattern (for sewing machine mat, thread catcher, pressing mat, and iron case), Velcro, jeans needle.



**V. Little Canna Fish with Linda Griffiths
(Intermediate)**

Create a beautiful canna leaf using raw-edge applique without fusible web or fabric glue! Class features original pattern. This little leaf can be the start of a larger multi-canna quilt. Finished size: 18” x 22” (leaf/background only) **Class Fee: \$35.00** includes: pattern, non-woven stabilizer, handouts, and a special “surprise” technique.



W. Sweatshirt Jacket Pizzazz with Sandy Davis (Intermediate to Advanced)

Turn a new or an old pullover sweatshirt or denim shirts into a new favorite jacket or. Jacket can be lengthened with a band at the bottom. Participants will embellish the jacket with flowers, rick rack, yo-yos etc. **Class Fee: \$35.00** includes: instructions.



X. Fit & Play – Embellished Tank with Marjorie Baker (Intermediate)

A simple tank can be a mainstay in any wardrobe. This is a two-part class; 1st will cover alterations needed to create a pattern that fits correctly across the bust, 2nd will be devoted to being creative with machine stitches or other embellishments. **Class Fee: \$15.00** includes: stabilizer and tissue paper for pattern alteration.



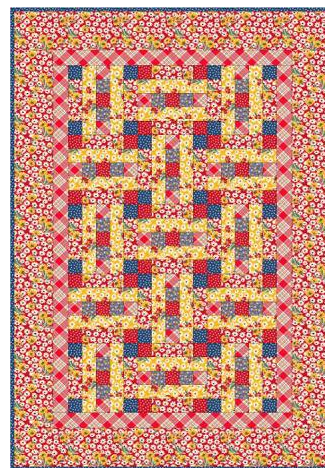
Y. Stripe One with Lynnette LeGette (Intermediate)

This project uses one striped fabric for the whole design. Awesome results, you must do to believe. No two quilts will look alike. The technique results will be revealed as you sew without using templates or strip sets. **Class Fee: \$30.00** includes: pattern, additional specific instructions, tips for success, and a useful tool.



Z. Strip Happy Mystery Quilt with Cindy Casciato (Intermediate)

Enjoy making a strip pieced lap size quilt top. It will be loads of fun as clues are unraveled to piece the blocks. Once the blocks are made, each quilter will arrange them into a quilt top and add the borders. **Class Fee: \$35.00** includes: pattern for multiple size quilts.



**AA. T-Shirt Quilt with Sheila Reinke
(Advanced Beginner)**

T-shirt quilts have become one of the most popular quilts to make. Use all those T-shirts you think about getting rid of. Participants will learn to work with t-shirt squares that are all the same size as well as multi sizes. This class can also be used with dress shirts, etc. It is possible to take this class even if you don't have any t-shirts at this time. **Class Fee: \$35.00.**

Dina Buckey is an award winning fiber artist whose work has been published in fiber magazines and as well as the book-*The Quilting Arts Book: Techniques and Inspiration for Creating One-of-a-Kind Quilts*.

Cindy Casciato is a teacher, designer, author from Ohio, but most importantly, a quilter with 30 years of experience in teaching quilting and related topics to numerous guilds and organizations. Her publications include "Block Explosion" released by Leisure Arts (fall of 2004), "One Stitch Quilting," KP Books (Spring 2006), "Stash with Splash" (August 2009) by KP Books.

Sandy Davis is a licensed Martha Pullen Beginning and Serger teacher, certified sulky teacher, certified Palmer/Pletsch Beginning and Fit Teacher and certified Master Clothing volunteer with 18 years teaching experience.

Linda Griffiths is an award winning quilter, who has exhibited at local, state and national levels. She teaches at the Hardin County Extension Office, numerous quilt shops, Jabez, and KHQS Getaway and offers technique-oriented, unique and original pattern workshops for guilds and others.

Rita Hardman – Quilter is her passion-teaching is her calling. She is certified in "Square in a Square" and "Magic Triangle" methods.

Jennifer Klee learned to sew as a 4-H'er and has never stopped! She taught sewing to 4-H youth and adults during her 30+ years as an Extension Agent, and recently retired.

Patsy Shields has presented Sew Better Seminars and written articles for several publications like "Sew News", "Sewing Savvy", "Round Bobbin Embroidery" and "Quilting Professional". Also appeared on several sewing TV shows, and has produced her own DVD on Ribbon Embroidery by Machine. She is the winner of the first ever Certified Master Sewing Educator Award.

Pat Sturtzel has sewn and made quilts for over 30 years. During the past five years, Pat has been mentored by Jane Dunnewold, author of several books on art cloth and textile surface design techniques. She teaches a variety of fiber art processes as a visiting artist in schools and community centers, including work with female refugees.

Sue Wash has been quilting since she was a young child. Her mother taught her hand-quilting and sewing on a treddle before rotary cutters and sewing machines came along.

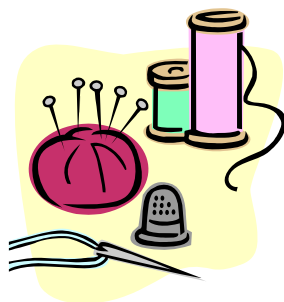
Kay Wilson has been quilting since the age of nine. She currently runs a machine quilting business and small fabric shop. Kay holds quilting classes in several counties in the area.
