Beginning Sewing for Adults

The beginning sewing for adults series consists of participants making a beginner clothing project during our 6 meeting sessions. Classes are usually held from 6:30-8:30PM at one of our offices - Durr Center off Taylor Mill Road or the Durr Annex on Dixie Highway. Participants are responsible for purchasing their own sewing supplies.



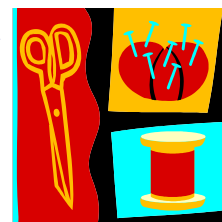
Participants will learn how to select fabric, use a sewing machine and basic sewing skills. You may bring your own sewing machine, or use one of ours. A list of materials needed will be distributed at the first class. There is a \$5.00 fee for this six session series.

Currently we have a waiting list for this popular series. We would be happy to add your name to our waiting list and contact you when the next series of classes begins.

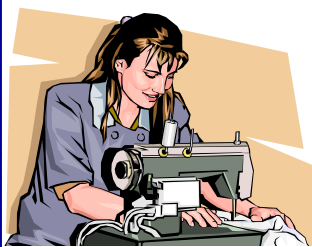
Monthly Sewing Project Group

For the individual with basic machine and hand sewing skills...

This is a new group to our program and is for those completing the beginning sewing for adults series, or those who can sew but wish to brush up on their skills. This series meets once a month, from 6:30 to 8:30 P.M. at one of our offices—Durr Center off Taylor Mill Road, or the Durr Annex on Dixie Highway. Participants will be notified as to specific programs upon registering.



During each session of the project group, we will be making an item that will teach or refresh at least one sewing skill. After participants complete their project, (if time permits) they are welcome to bring in a project of their choice to work on. This project can be something you need to cut out, need help with a technique, or just some time away from home to sew!
