RUMPKE RECYCLING COLLECTION INFORMATION

Starting August 1st you will be able to drop-off recyclables at the Leslie County Transfer Station!!!

Did you know that 60% of items that are placed in a landfill could have been recycled? Pitch in! Only the items stated are accepted in the program. Placing trash or other non-acceptable items in your recycling container may contaminate the entire container or recyclables. Recyclables are also contaminated when they are placed in non-acceptable plastic bags. Please use PAPER BAGS instead! Please recycle these items:

Plastic: Soda, Milk, detergent, shampoo & small-mouth bottles with a #1 or #2 on the bottom.

Paper: White ledger paper (personal computer, copy machine and type-writer paper; white ledger pads, adding machine tape). Folders, Mail, Magazines, Envelopes, Brown Papers, News Quality Paper, Cardboard and Paperboard, and Phone books.

Cans: Aluminum and bi-metal beverage cans, steel food/tin cans and empty aerosol cans.

-Labels do not need to be removed.
-Please rinse and flatten.
-No lids, please!

The Following Items are NOT Acceptable:

- * Plastic bags
- * Caps
- * Paint cans
- * Pizza Boxes
- * Light bulbs
- * Styrofoam
- * Dirty plates, cups, napkins, or facial tissue.
- * Coat hangers
- * Steel scrap
- * Broken glass
- * Window or drinking glass.

How You Are Helping!

- About 80% of what Americans throw away is recyclable, yet our recycling rate is only 28%.
- Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a TV for three hours.
- If all of our newspapers were recycled, we could save about 250 million trees each year!

WHAT ARE YOUR RECYCLABLES MADE INTO?

Plastic: New bottles, carpet fibers, drainage pipes, park furniture.

Newspaper: More newsprint, paperboard, construction paper, animal bedding.

Steel Cans: New tin, steel products.

Aluminum Cans: New cans, rain gutters, window frames.
