From London: Travel I-75 south to the south Williamsburg Exit (Hwy 92), take Hwy 92 west to Hwy 27 in Pine Knot, turn right onto Hwy 27 north and go to the second stop light, turn left onto Hwy 92 west, travel approximately ¼ mile and turn right onto Raider Way, follow Raider Way all the way to the end. Travel time is approximately 1 hour 15 minutes.

From Oneida, TN: Travel Hwy 27 north and cross the state line into Kentucky, go to the third stop light and turn left onto Hwy 92 west, travel approximately ¼ mile and turn right onto Raider Way, follow Raider Way all the way to the end. Travel time is approximately 25 minutes.
