

OWSLEY COUNTY FAIR DAYS

September 7th thru 10th, 2010

It's that time of year again! Owsley County Fair Days have been set for September 7th – 10th, 2010. The theme of this year's fair is "Celebrating the Past – Looking Into the Future".

The Owsley County Cooperative Extension Service will be hosting the exhibits for the county fair at the Owsley County Elementary School Library. Entries will cost .50 cents per entry or 3 for \$1.00. Prizes will be given for 1st, 2nd & 3rd place for each class. First place will receive \$3.00 and a blue ribbon, second place will receive \$1.00 and a red ribbon and third place will receive a white ribbon. The entries must fit into one of the categories and classes listed and should not have been entered before. No new classes will be added. **Fair entries can be entered on Tuesday, September 7th, from 8:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. or on Wednesday, September 8th, from 8:30a.m. – 12:00 p.m.** All entries will be judged on Wednesday after lunch. Ribbons will be placed on winning entries by Thursday morning. The exhibits area will be open for viewing on Thursday from 8:30 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. and on Friday from 8:30 a.m. until right before the parade begins at 1:00 p.m. all entries must be picked up by Friday, September 10th after the parade -4:30 p.m. Be sure when registering that we have your name and address to insure that you will receive your check if you are a first or second place winning exhibitor.

We are following the same guidelines as we did last year. The exhibit items must be made or grown by children if it is entered in their name. The issue in the past has been that items have been entered in children's name but maybe have not been grown or made by them and those items were in competition with other children's items. Those categories with a * by them represent categories that 4-H/Youth/FFA are allowed to participate in. All other categories are adult-only categories for this year. Adults can enter any category.
